He is presently doing post-graduate performance study in organ with Dr. Frederic Homan, Professor of Music at CMSU. Mr. Quimby is a member of Pi Kappa Lambda, national honor society in music, Kappa Delta Pi, national honor society in education, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, national music fraternity, the American Guild of Organists, the American Institute of Organbuilders, the Organ Historical Society, the American Choral Directors Association, National Music Educators Conference, Missouri Music Educators Association, and the Choristers Guild. He has a growing organ business which includes a tuning and maintenance service as well as building new organs and restoring and rebuilding older organs. In addition since 1974, Mr. Quimby has taught high school vocal music at Knob Noster, Mo. Mr. Quimby is presently serving as organist at the First United Methodist Church at Warrensburg where he also directs one of the children's choirs.
