Quimby Pipe Organs is a 25-year old firm specializing in the service, tuning, rebuilding and building of pipe organs. The company has rebuilt, restored or crafted new instruments in many regions of the United States. Additionally, it has a tuning and maintenance service area that covers all of Missouri, Kansas, western Illinois, southern Iowa and portions of Arkansas and Oklahoma. Quimby Pipe Organs presently has 11 full-time employees. The company hold 268 service contracts for tunings and maintenance with a variety of churches, auditoriums, universities and individuals.

Michael Quimby, organbuilder, received a Bachelor of Music Education degree (1973) and a Master of Arts degree in music history (1975) from Central Missouri State University, Warrensburg, Mr. Quimby

is a member of Pi Kappa Lambda national honor society of music and the American Institute of Organbuilders, of which he served as president from 1991-1994. Additionally, he served on the board of directors and chair of the ethics committee (1987-1989) for the AIO. He is a member of the American Guild of Organists, having served as dean of the greater Kansas City chapter (1988-1989); the Organ Historical Society; and the American Choral Directors Association.

He is president of Quimby Pipe Organs Inc. His company is a member of Associated Pipe Organ Builders of America (APOBA). Mr. Quimby currently serves as organist at First United Methodist Church in Warrensburg.

About the organ =

The pipe organ installed in First Presbyterian Church electric drawknobs by Harris Precision Products, was built by M. P. Möller of Hagerstown, Maryland, in 1952 as opus 8,318. The three-manual and pedal level capture combination action and multiplex switchinsturment has 28 ranks and was rebuilt by Quimby Pipe Organs Inc. It features a new seven-rank Great All retained windchests and reservoirs from the origi-Principal chorus and new Choir Gedeckt 8', Nachthorn 4'-2' unit, Nazard 2 2/3', Tierce 1 3/5' and revoiced Oboe 8'.

All remaining pipes retained from the original Möller balcony wall. installation were adjusted for correct speech and electro-pneumatic windchests were provided for all pipes in the main organ not located on offset or pedal chests.

The original console has been rebuilt with new all- and Randy Watkins.
