The pipe organ for Ascension Lutheran Church was built by M. P. Möller of Hagerstown, Maryland, in 1966, as opus 10246. In 1993 the instrument was secured through the assistance of Michael Quimby for rebuilding and installation by Quimby Pipe Organs Inc., of Warrensburg, Missouri. It is a two-manual electro-pneumatic instrument with nine ranks and 657 pipes.

The new casework is constructed of mahogany and contains 15 polished copper pipes with tin mouths. Fourteen pipes are functional and are part of the Great 8' Principal.

The pipes of the instrument were revoiced and regulated for the new location. The electro-pneumatic windchests and reservoirs were releathered.
