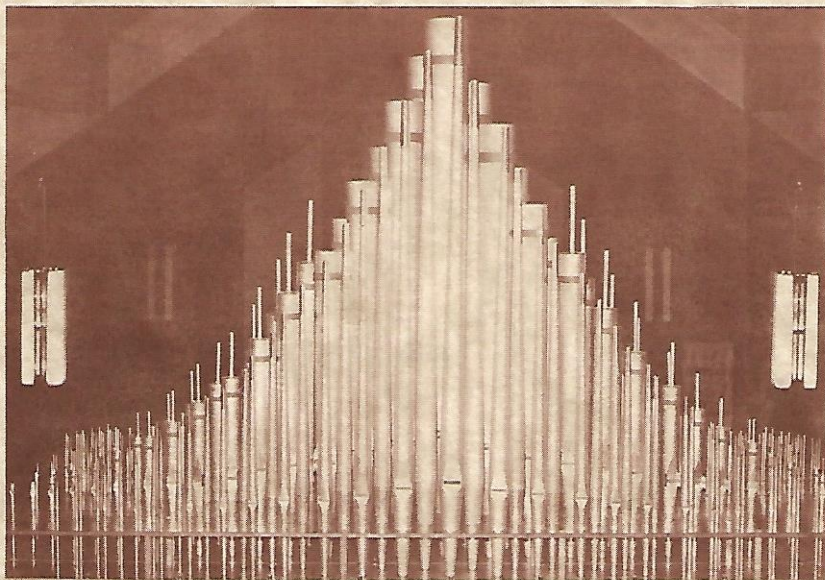

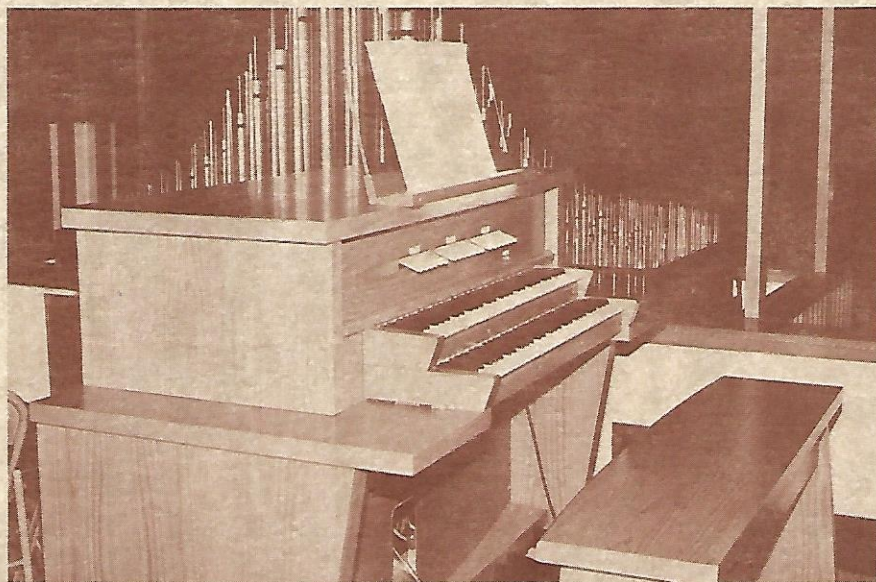

The Organ Builder

Michael Quimby, organ builder, received a B.M.E. degree in 1973 and his M.A. in music history and literature with applied emphasis in organ in 1975 from Central Missouri State University at Warrensburg. Mr. Quimby is a member of Pi Kappa Lambda, national honor society in music; Kappa Delta Pi, national honor society in education; Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, national music fraternity; the American Guild of Organists; the American Institute of Organ Builders; the Organ Historical Society; the American Choral Directors Association; National Music Educators Conference; Missouri Music Educators Association; and the Choristers Guild. He has a growing organ business which includes a tuning and maintenance service as well as building new organs and restoring and rebuilding older organs. Mr. Quimby is presently serving as organist at the First United Methodist Church at Warrensburg where he also directs one of the children's choirs.
